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## Grassroots Development Programmes

### Objective

To establish a nationwide grassroots structure that introduces Roll Ball to children and youth, promotes equal participation, and builds a sustainable pipeline of athletes representing Sri Lanka in regional and international competitions.

### Key Programmes

#### 1. School Roll Ball Programme – “Roll Ball Shikshana”

- Introduce Roll Ball into PE curriculum and extracurricular activities.
- Provide starter kits and demo sessions in schools.
- Train PE teachers to conduct weekly sessions.
- *Target:* 1,000 schools engaged by 2027 with 100,000+ children introduced to Roll Ball.

#### 2. Community Roll Ball Clinics – “Gami Roll Ball”

- Weekend sessions in towns, villages, and underserved areas.
- Local volunteers and youth icons as trainers.
- Free-to-access programme with basic equipment.
- *Target:* 25,000 children from low-income backgrounds by 2028.

#### 3. Women’s Empowerment Through Roll Ball – “Sthree Shakthi Roll Ball”

- All-girls camps and mentorship by leading female athletes.
- Scholarships for talented players from rural backgrounds.
- *Goal:* Achieve at least 35% female participation by 2026.

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#### 4. Youth Academies & Mini Clubs – “Roll Ball Sathkara Network”

- Formation of academies at district and provincial levels.
- Structured coaching pathways with recognition from RBFSL.
- *Goal:* 200+ clubs functional across Sri Lanka by 2027.

#### 5. Annual “National Roll Ball Week” – “Lanka Roll Ball Uthsavaya”

- Nationwide campaign with exhibitions, friendly matches, and awards.
- Recognition of grassroots coaches and volunteers.
- *Goal:* Active engagement in 100+ locations each year.

#### 6. Coaches at the Base (CAB) Scheme – “Roll Ball Guru Programme”

- Train and deploy grassroots coaches in rural and semi-urban areas.
- Certification courses and honorariums for local trainers.
- *Target:* 500 certified grassroots coaches by 2026.

#### 7. Outreach in Plantation & Rural Districts – “Upahara Roll Ball Drive”

- Special programmes in tea plantation communities and underserved districts.
- Provincial-level rural Roll Ball tournaments.
- *Goal:* Introduce Roll Ball to 25 rural divisions by 2028.

#### 8. Youth Leadership & Volunteer Network – “Roll Ball Yuva Sena”

- Engage university students and young professionals.
- Roles include event assistants, coaches, media volunteers.
- *Target:* Mobilize 1,000 youth volunteers in 3 years.

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## 9. Equipment Donation Bank – “Roll Ball Piyasa”

- Collection of used gear and distribution to rural schools/clubs.
- Partnerships with NGOs and CSR sponsors.
- Annual “Donate to Play” campaign

## 10. Partnerships with Government & NGOs – “Lanka Sport Synergy Plan”

- Work with the Education Ministry, Sports Ministry, and NGOs.
- Leverage national fitness and youth development schemes.
- Co-host provincial grassroots sports events.
